

Molecular Imprints leaving ATI, signs lease

Austin-based Molecular Imprints Inc. is relocating to Far Northwest Austin, leaving behind the Austin Technology Incubator's digs in Northwest Austin.

Molecular Imprints recently signed a five-year lease for about 16,000 square feet at 1807 Braker Lane, according to a Trammell Crow Co. news release.

Molecular Imprints, founded in February 2001, is a nanotechnology company. Nanoscientists study material and processes at the nanometer level, which is 50,000 times smaller than the width of a human hair.

The company is developing a lithography tool for the semiconductor industry. The tool will imprint minute designs onto a chip wafer.

The Austin Technology Incubator is the entrepreneurial arm of the IC2 Institute at the University of Texas.

Brian Liverman, associate at Trammell Crow, represented the owner in the deal. Max Moss, senior associate at Trammell Crow, represented Molecular Imprints.

Molecular Imprints recently closed on \$9.2 million in venture capital.
